# **My Plan Tutorial**

#### Deanna Maki:

In this tutorial, I'll show you how to create your own video playlist. All you need to do is just click on the 'My Plan' tab. You'll start with an empty playlist. In order to start accessing videos, you're going to click on the 'Search Categories' button. You'll see a list of commonly searched terms, or tags. These will help you shortlist the videos, so you can find just the right one.

#### Deanna Maki:

If you're looking for videos on higher level thinking skills, click on the 'Higher Level Thinking Skills' tab to see the list of videos that have already been determined as being great examples of higher-level thinking skills in the classroom. You can scroll through this list to find just the right video. You can preview it by clicking on the 'View' button, and you can also just add it to your plan. I can work through this list and continue to add videos to my plan as I go. To go back to the previous category, I can click on 'My Plan', or I can click on the 'Search' button.

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If I'd like to find videos aligned to a certain evaluation rubric, I can also select 'Evaluation Rubrics' and select from one of the preloaded rubrics that are available here. I can also search for experts to see which educational experts are featured in the academy and I can also search for classroom examples at certain grade levels and subject areas. As I find activities that I want to include in my plan, I'm going to continue to build it and watch it add up. Click on the 'My Plan' tab at any time to see how many videos you've loaded into your personal playlist. If you scroll to the bottom, you'll see the total.
